 - Applied the Oral Method of Harold E. Palmer to Japanese language teaching
 - Produced a textbook 'Standard Japanese Readers'
- Number of students: **600 from 46 countries**
- Number of teaching staff: 60 incl. part-time teachers

- b. International class

SP 19 – 24 2 classes formed according to initial level.

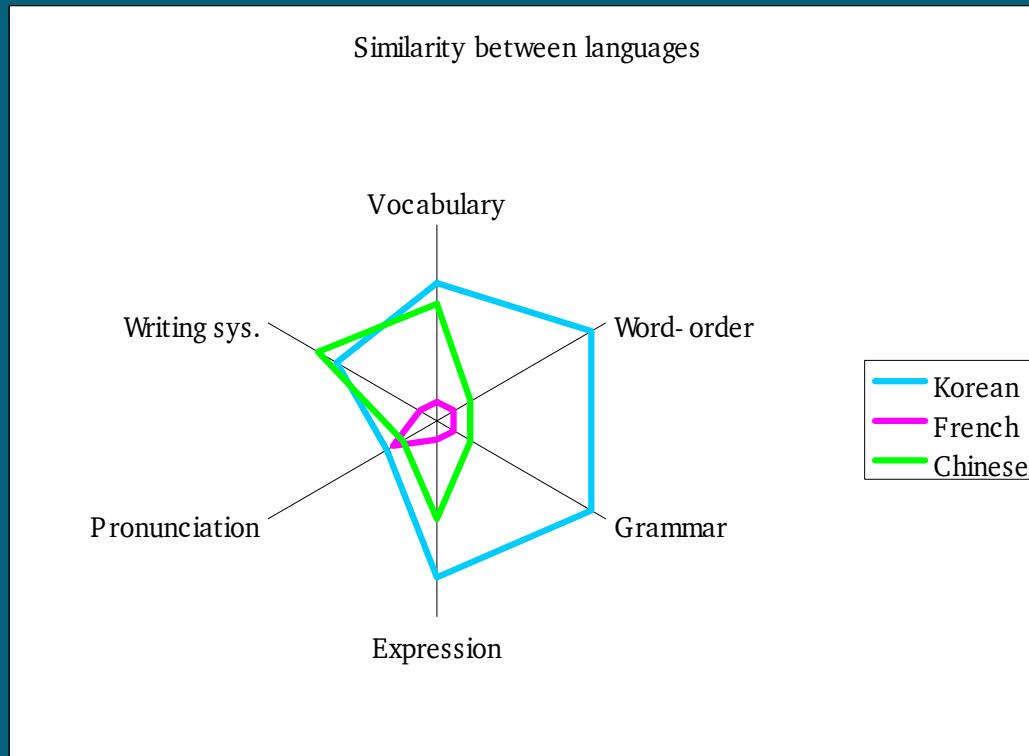

More content geared to in-company communication

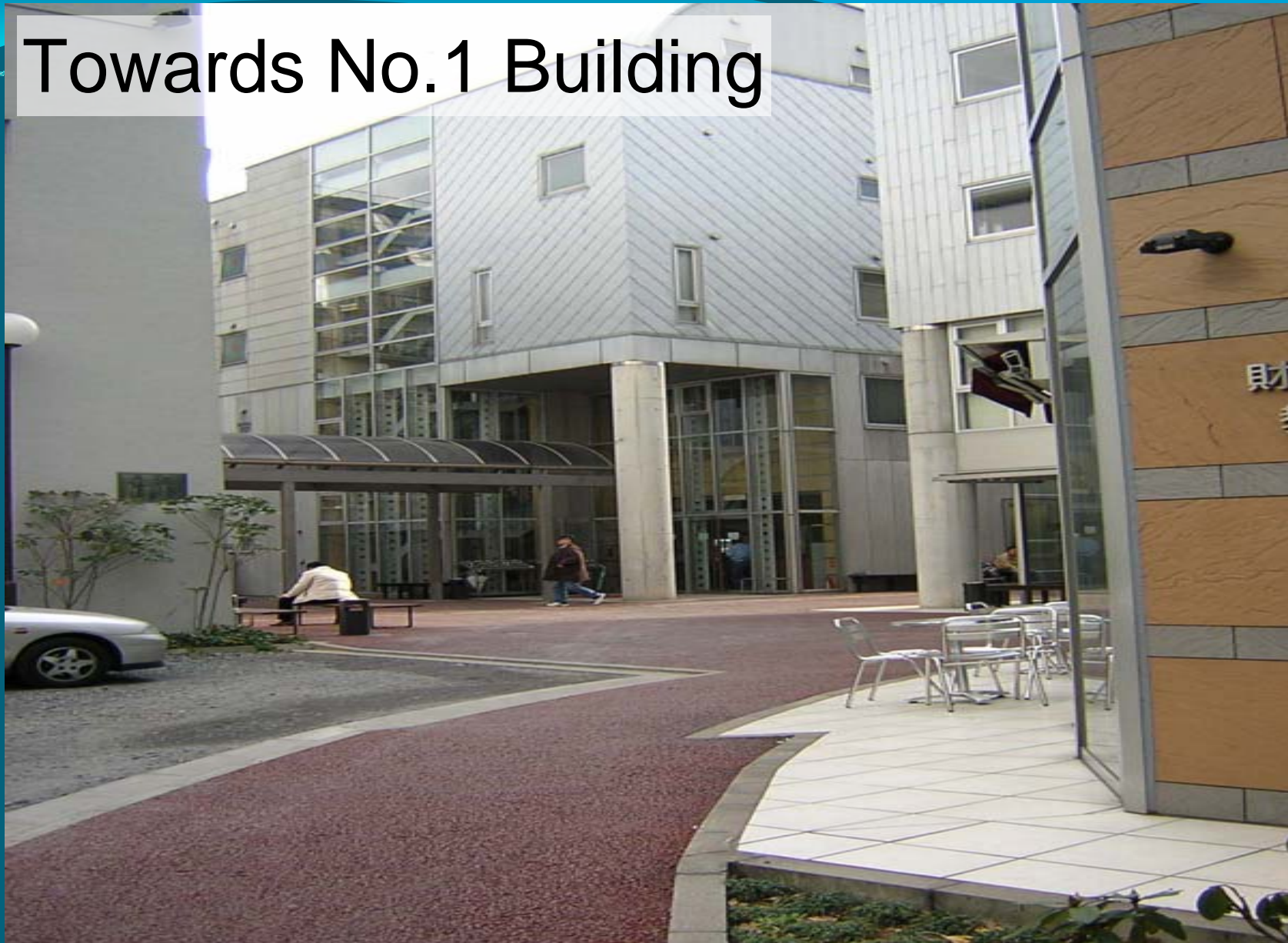
- Formal talk to informal talk

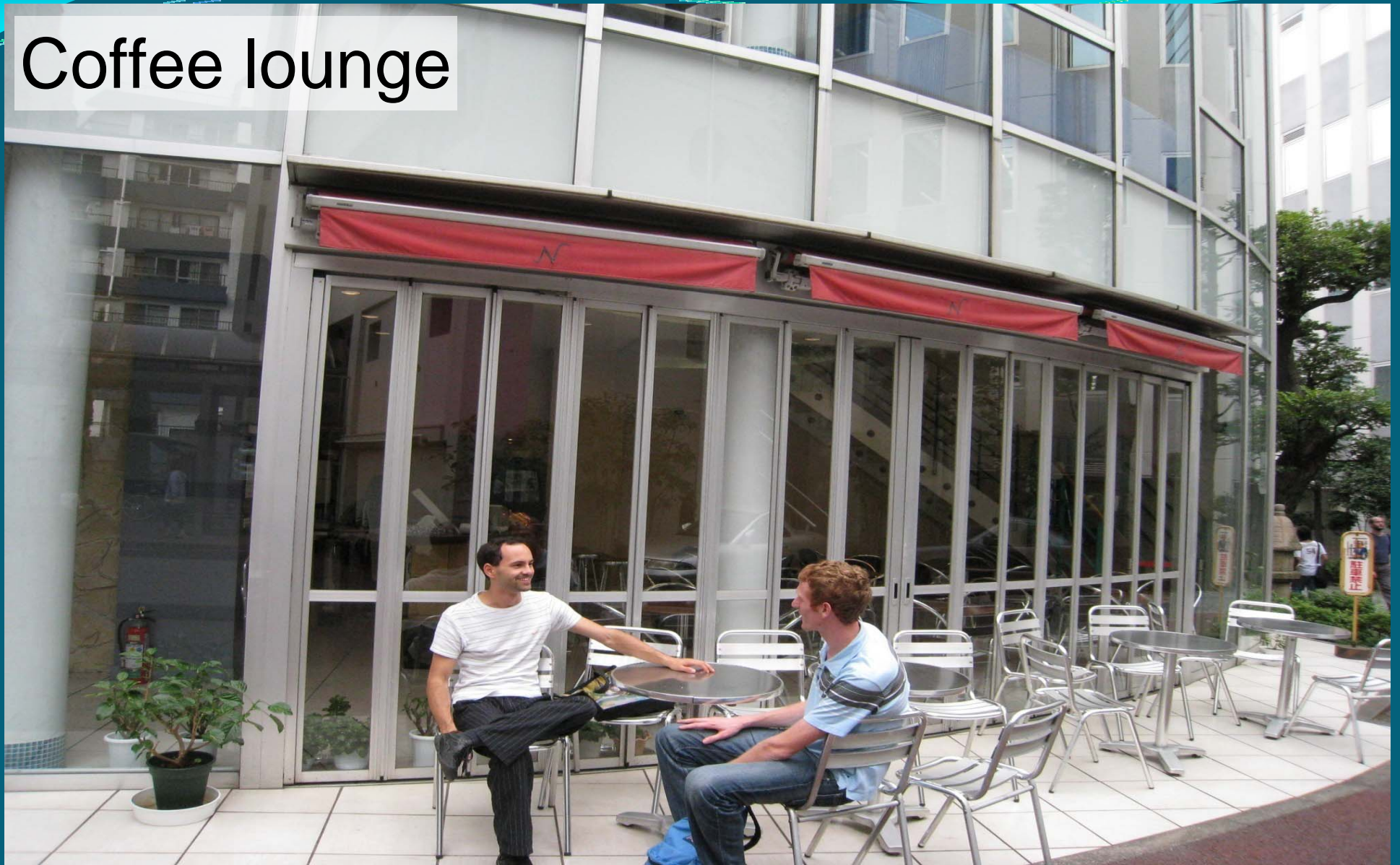

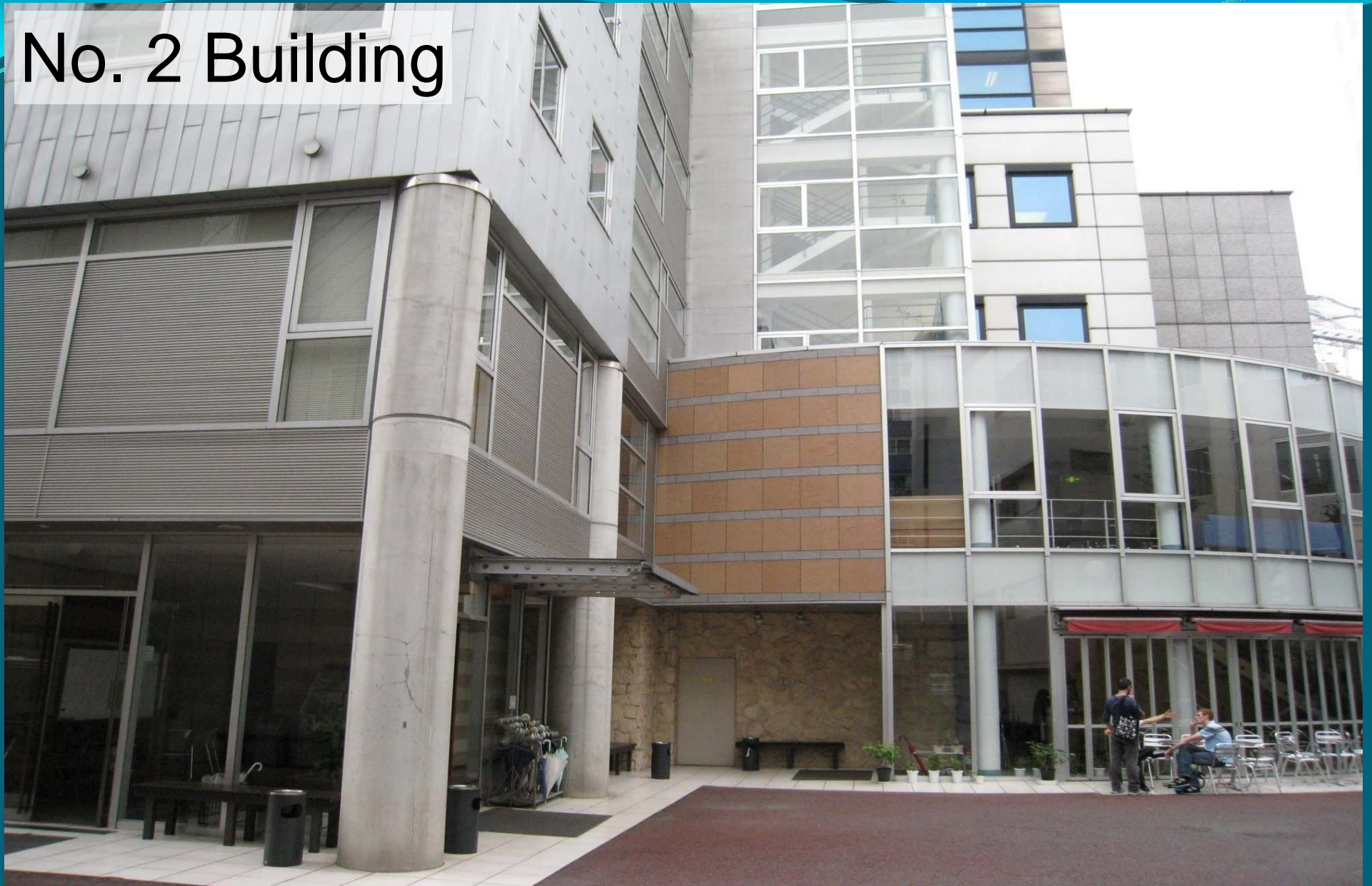

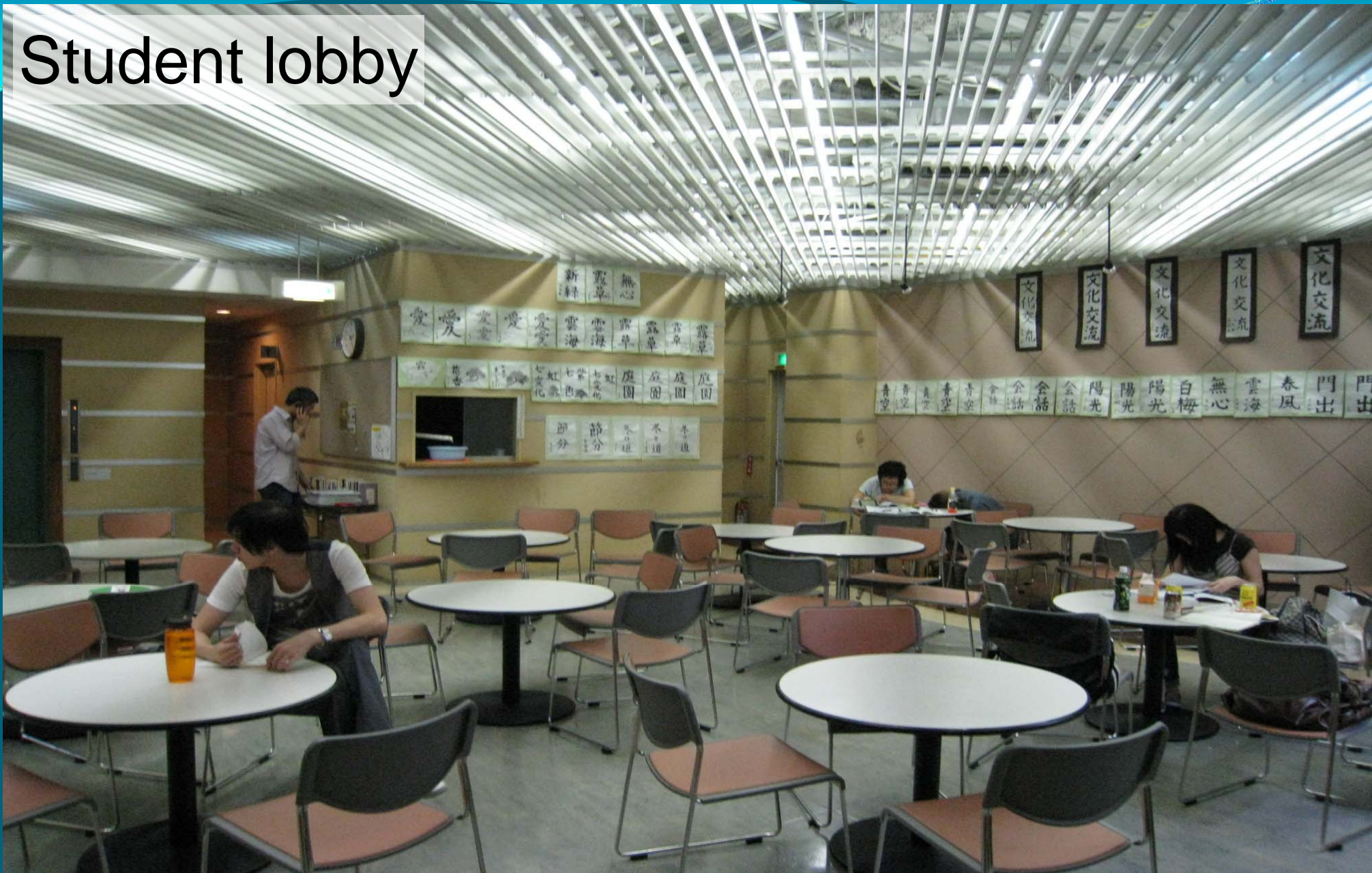
